Thank you to all those parents who attended one of the two Information Sessions last Tuesday evening at the East Maitland Bowling Club. It was a great opportunity to share with you some of the plans and progress that will see St Bede's College ready for business for incoming Year 7 students from Day 1 next year.

As per my email last week, I thank all those parents, students and parishioners who contributed to the consultation process which led to the development of a Foundation Plan which was launched at these meetings. In addition to the launch of the Foundation Plan, there was the outline of the rationale behind the visual identity of the College which included the research behind the recommendations given to Bishop Bill on the school colours, motto and crest. The colour palette will be black/grey as the base colour and violet and then to a lesser extent gold/yellow as the support colours.



As a follow-up to the presentation on the building design and a progress report on Stage One of the building works, I will attempt to keep you up-dated on its progress. Whereas it may appear that progress is slow due to such a wet March, a lot of work is being done that would normally be completed at the back-end of the project. This will mean that progress once the preparation work is completed will be much quicker than most normal building projects. I will keep you posted on progress and up-coming events it is anticipated next term that we launch a St Bede's web-site and the confirmed visual Identity of the College. Consultation with the parents and students in regards to the uniform design will be on-going in coming weeks. Preparation has also begun for our first full meeting of all enrolled students early next term at a venue to be announced.

As outlined at the meetings, enrolment applications are now being processed. With the submission of a fully completed enrolment application by the specified date from the two feeder schools, St Aloysius Chisholm and Our Lady of Lourdes Tarro, guaranteeing their enrolment, interview priority has been given to students within the assigned geographical boundaries from non-feeder schools. One-on-one meeting with the feeder school families will occur before the end of the year but can be arranged beforehand if there are particular issues you would like to discuss.

After sharing the news story of our first non-feeder school student being enrolled, I have gained the permission of the other non-feeder school students who have been offered and accepted a place for next year. Below is a short profile of each of these students who will bring their own gifts and unique personalities to our community.
